ASSESSMENT/EXAM AND EVALUATION POLICY FOR CLASSES NURSERY TO XII

ACADEMIC SESSION 2025-26

CLASSES Nursery to II:

The Academic Year 2025-26 shall be divided into **two terms** (**Term-I: April 2025 to September 2025/Term-II: October 2025 to March 2026).** The students will be assessed continuously and comprehensively under SBA throughout the year on the basis of day-to-day activities/worksheets and assignments. There shall be no formal examination for Classes: Nursery to II.

CLASSES III-V:

The Academic Year shall be divided into two terms (Term-I: April 2025 to September 2025/Term-II: October 2025 to March 2026).). The students will be assessed continuously and comprehensively throughout the year on the basis of PERIODIC TESTS and TERM END EXAMINATIONS.

One cycle of Periodic Test and Term End Examination will be conducted in each term as in the following parameters:

- Minimum qualifying grade for each subject in scholastic domain is **D**.
- Any Application/Medical certificate with a request letter should be submitted at the reception within 3 days of the leave taken after which it will not be accepted and the student will be marked absent and awarded 'Zero'.
- For a student using unfair means/cheating during any examination, the answer sheet would not be evaluated and the student would be awarded 'Zero' in that exam.

• No student shall be allowed to take the Annual Examination unless he/she has completed 75% attendance.

CLASSES VI TO VIII:

The academic year shall be divided into two terms (Term-I: April 2025 to September 2025/Term-II: October 2025 to March 2026). The students will be assessed continuously and comprehensively throughout the year on the basis of PERIODIC TESTS and TERM END EXAMINATIONS.

- 1. The academic structure for class-X for the academic year 2025-26 will be according to the Remodeled Assessment Structure as per CBSE.
- 2. 3 Periodic Tests will be conducted in the Academic Year for every subject.
- 3. Average of the best 2 Periodic Tests will be taken (reduced to 05 marks) for the Final Marks submission.
- 4. Syllabus for the Periodic Test will increase cumulatively.
- 5. Board Exams will cover 100% syllabus of each subject.
- 6. Students have to secure 33% marks in Internal Assessment and Board Examinations, together.
- 7. Different activities will be conducted in the entire year for Subject Enrichment Activity
 For awarding the grades, the Board shall put all the passed students in a rank order and will award grades as follows:

- No student shall be allowed to take the Annual Examination unless he/she has completed 75% attendance.
- In case of long-term absenteeism on medical grounds, only 15% of medical leave shall be considered. 60% regular attendance is compulsory as per CBSE attendance by-laws.

Eligibility for Compartment:

- 1. A student failing in 2 subjects shall be placed in compartment in those subjects, provided he/she qualifies in all the subjects of Internal Assessments.
- 2. A maximum of 5 marks grace can be awarded for upto 2 subjects for promotion. Grace marks and compartment cannot be awarded together to a student.

Class XII

To ensure continuous and comprehensive evaluation in alignment with CBSE norms, the following assessment plan will be followed for **Class XII**:

- Periodic Tests (40 marks) will be conducted in both terms to assess students' ongoing academic progress and exam readiness.
- Half-Yearly Examination will include:

- o Theory and Practical Assessment for subjects involving practicals.
- o Theory and Internal/Project Assessment for other academic subjects.
- Two Pre-Board Examinations will be conducted to give students hands-on practice with full syllabus in a board-like environment.
- Final Assessment will be based on the CBSE Board Examination pattern:

Additional Notes:

- One **Periodic Assessment/Pre-Board** of 40/80 marks is conducted in **each term** for all subjects (practice purpose, school discretion).
- **Promotion in Class XI** is based on **cumulative performance** of both terms.
- Internal Assessment / Practical is spread across both terms for holistic evaluation.
- In order to be declared 'Pass', a student must secure at least 35% marks in each of the subjects studied by him/her, separately in both Theory and Practical/Project/Internal Assessment (IA) examinations.
- If a student fails to secure at least 35% in the theory component of any one subject, a compartment will be given in theory only. The same policy applies to Practical/Project/Internal Assessment components.
- A student shall be detained in Class XI if he/she is unable to secure 35% marks separately in both Theory and Practical/Project/Internal Assessment examinations in two or more subjects. To be declared 'Pass', a student must secure at least 35% marks in each of the five main subjects (separately in Theory and Internal Assessment) in the Annual Examination.
- It is compulsory for students to appear in all assessments. However, if a student remains absent on any assessment day due to unavoidable circumstances or medical reasons, parents are requested to inform the school.
- In case of any medical discomfort experienced by the child, kindly refrain from sending the child to school, including on assessment days.
- The school does not have any provision for early dispersal, including on assessment days.
- No retest will be conducted under any circumstances.
- The minimum qualifying grade for each subject in the scholastic domain is 'D'.
- Any application/medical certificate with a request letter should be submitted at the reception under the student leave application within three (3) days of the leave taken. Applications submitted after three days will not be accepted, and the student will be marked absent and awarded 'Zero'.
- For a student found using unfair means or cheating during any examination, the answer sheet will not be evaluated, and the student will be awarded 'Zero' in that exam.
- No student shall be allowed to take the Annual Examination unless he/she has completed 75% attendance.
- In case of long-term absenteeism on medical grounds, only 15% of medical leave shall be considered. 60% regular attendance is compulsory as per CBSE attendance by-laws.

• A student failing in one of the five main subjects shall be placed in **COMPARTMENT** in that subject and **ONLY ONE ATTEMPT** of **RE-TEST** shall be provided in the **Annual Examination**.

Additional Notes

- The students of Class-IX & XI who have opted Information Technology/ Marketing & Sales/Yoga/ Marketing as Optional/Additional Subject, the modalities as per CBSE guidelines shall be applicable as per circular.
- Optional/Additional Subject shall not be taken into consideration for promotion from Class-IX/XI to Class-X/XII.
- Student failing in two or more subjects shall be detained in Class-IX/XI.

- 1. Assessment for Balvatika classes shall follow the guidelines in 'The Preschool Curriculum' (NCERT, Chapter 6, Pg 54-56) and NCFFS 2023.
- 2. Classes I & II Assessment:
 - a. Guidelines outlined in NCFFS 2022 (Chapter 6, Pg 169-184) shall be followed.
- 3. Competency-Based Assessment:
 - a. Assessment shall measure achievement of Competencies and Learning Outcomes in alignment with NCF SE 2023 (Section 3.4).
- 4. No Detention Policy:
 - a. As per the RTE Act, no student from Classes I to VIII shall be detained in 2025-26
 - b. A similar policy may be adopted for Balvatika classes.
- 5. Multi-Disciplinary Projects (MDP) Classes III to VIII:
 - a. One MDP per term shall be assigned for all subjects.
 - b. Additional MDPs may be assigned if required to cover all subjects.
- 6. Assessment of Arts, Work Experience, Health & Physical Education (Classes III-IX & XI): Assessed by TGT (WET), TGT (AE), and TGT (P&HE) in collaboration with subject teachers.
- 7. Evaluated on **3-point/6-point/9-point scale** as per guidelines.
- 8. Relevant records must be maintained.
- 9. Art-Integrated Projects (Classes I to X): Each student must complete one Art-Integrated Project per subject.
- 10. Projects must be trans-disciplinary and submitted via KALASETU portal (CBSE).
- 11. Supplementary Examinations (Classes IX & XI):
 - a. They will be conducted in the last week of March 2026
